

The world's only 1963 Chevrolet Corvette Coupe Speciale "Rondine" will be sold at no reserve during the 37th Annual Barrett-Jackson Collector Car Event. The Corvette Rondine was built for the 1963 Paris Auto Show and was preserved at the Pininfarina Museum.

Craig Jackson, chairman and CEO of the Barrett-Jackson Auction Co., said few Corvette concept cars find their way into private hands and the Rondine offers an incredible opportunity to elevate a collection from very nice into the "realm of the exceptional."

The event will be held Jan 12-20 in Scottsdale.

Steve Davis, president of the Barrett-Jackson Auction Co., said the Rondine blends American power with "bold Italian design."

He also said that because the Rondine was part of the Pininfarina Museum collection since its unveiling, the car is in pristine condition.

"The important historical significance of this Corvette will make the 'Rondine' one of the most anticipated cars available during our Scottsdale event," he said.




