

Charity News from the Challenged Athletes Foundation – Candi Daher, Club Representative Athletes' Stories

Carlos Moleda grew up in São Paulo, Brazil. At age 18, he chose a life of adventure, moved to the United States and joined the Navy. His ability to work hard and learn fast eventually won him a coveted spot as a Navy SEAL. A few years later, he found himself in the middle of an intense firefight in Panama. Nine of the 10 men in his unit were wounded – four fatally. Carlos was hit near his spine and leg, and lost feeling in his lower body forever. Competitive sports proved to be the best way to recover from this traumatic injury. Through an unyielding spiritand a passion for competition, Carlos turned his misfortune into his greatest adventure: becoming a champion. Today, Carlos is a winner of the 367-mile Sadlers Ultra Challenge handcycle race in Alaska, a two-time National Handcycling Champion and a three-time Hawaii Ironman Champion where he holds the record for the physically challenged division. Carlos appreciates how far he's come. To help others, he serves as a spokesman for the Challenged Athletes Foundation and uses his expertise and motivational skills to teach younger kids with disabilities how to ride handcycles.

Meet the Members - Todd and Jamie



Our Members of the Month for June, Todd and Jamie, have been active members of North County Corvette Club for the past six years. Todd was born in Long Beach, CA and Jamie in Sommerton, AZ. Todd says, "I grew

up in the Los Angeles area, Downey to be specific. You might remember it by the TV Commercial, "A beautiful place to lease or buy a beautiful car, Bob Spreen Cadillac —"Where the Freeways meet, in Downey". (Feature writer's note: I remember it well since Todd and I graduated from the same high school—Downey High—some five years apart!) Todd later moved to San Diego in 1983. Jamie spent her younger years in Yuma, AZ and she has lived off and on in both AZ and San Diego.

While Todd has no kids of his own, he shares Jamie's 3 children, Jeromy, 29; Casey, just turning 17; and Cayla, 12. Jeromy and his wife, Brooke, have a son, whose name is Gavin Alexander. They all call him G-Man!

Todd is a Facilities Engineer with Qualcomm, Inc. who runs a crew of 6 men that maintain two of the 39 Qualcomm buildings located in San Diego. I might get some argument on that, but this is about me right?" (Yes, it is, Todd.) He also added, "I must admit I love the classics. I wouldn't mind a C5 though for the handling and drivability."

During his membership in NCoCC, Todd boasts that he has held the most demanding position on the Board twice...Sgt. at Arms! He is currently nominated for Vice President and for Sgt. at Arms once again. Todd and Jamie both enjoy playing pool, but Todd says, "A word of warning, don't play Jamie for money! She is very good!" Todd used to water ski a lot, but hasn't been doing that lately. He reports that, "I still have my boat and finished rebuilding my truck motor last November and got that back on the road, so I guess I could get the boat back in the water." He went out to go to work one morning and found that both seats had been stolen from the car. He didn't have another means to get to work so he made a driver's seat out of a piece of 2 x 12 and used it until his new seats arrived at Paramount Chevrolet. Once he got those in, it was about a month until the seats were stolen again from the parking lot behind his office in Norwalk. I can't remember when he was more pissed off! Luckily, he hadn't yet dismantled the "wooden wonder seat" and put it back in until the seats could be re-ordered and arrived. I don't think he took that seat apart for about a year!" 


